In line with the EU regulations on state subsidies, the European Commission approved the Croatian subsidy programme for the production of electric power from renewable energy sources in the amount of 783 million EUR. The measure will help Croatia to attain its goals related to energy from renewable.

The Croatian Ministry of Environmental Protection and Green Transition and the Environmental Protection and Energy Efficiency Fund (FZOEU) plan to allocate EUR 652 million in subsidies for renewable energy, decarbonization of district heating systems and road traffic and waste management. The

Croatia's Ministry of Environmental Protection and Green Transition has announced plans to allocate €651.8 million in grants next year. Of this amount, €526.8 million will come from the European Union's 2021-2027 competition and cohesion program, the EU's national recovery and resilience plan, and.

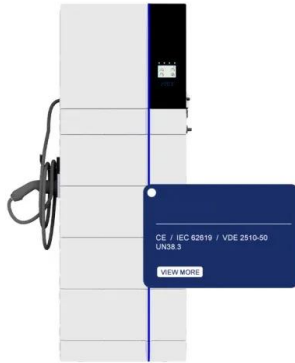

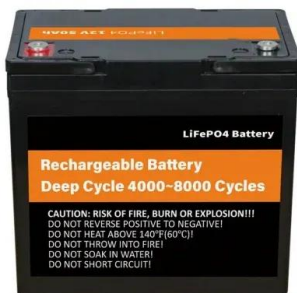

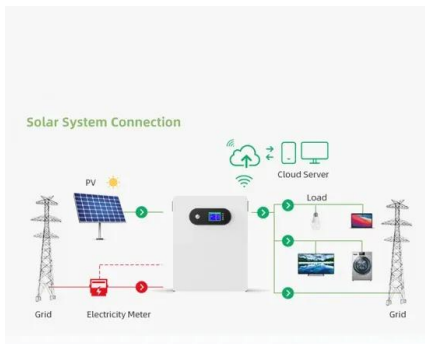
