## Article 2: Key Concepts in Electricity Storage

Together, the power and the capacity determine how long it will take to fill (charge) or empty (discharge) the energy storage system. Specifically, dividing the capacity by the power tells us the duration,  $d$ , of filling or emptying:  $d = E/P$ .



## 10.2 Key Metrics and Definitions for Energy Storage

This parameter relates the storage capacity to the size or the mass of the system, essentially showing how much energy (Wh) can be stored per unit cell, unit mass (kg), or unit volume (liter) of the material or device.
